Preface:

From the very first days of the establishment of the Islamic Republic regime in 1979 in Iran, it began its activities as a r terrorist regime and hostile to the people, both in terms of its approach towards the people of Iran and in adopting foreign policies. Various organizations, groups, and political figures opposed it. As we entered the 21st century, this regime radically continued in both approaches, leading to more serious opposition from the Iranian people. Consequently, activists, both individuals and legal entities, have pursued various strategies to fight against the Islamic Republic, generally referred to as the opposition to the Islamic Republic. The influence and impact of these opposition groups have varied and sometimes have had interactive or reactive effects on each other.

Despite more than four decades since the existence of the Islamic Republic, none of these groups have succeeded in completely defeating it. The structural and discursive diversity of these groups has even hindered the creation of political discipline in mobilizing a collective effort. In this study, an attempt has been made to provide an informational structure (infographic) of some prominent groups to evaluate their level of performance and impact.

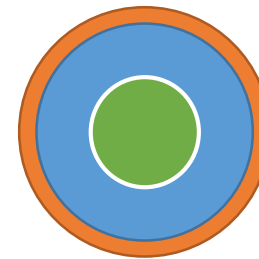
Introduction to the Model

The model considered for evaluating the structural information of political groups is organized as an advanced cellular organism. Based on this cellular organism, which is designed in multiple layers or levels for information classification, an attempt has been made to thoroughly dissect the physical and qualitative characteristics of a combative political entity to ensure that strengths and weaknesses can be distinctly recognized during information analysis and processing.

The main indicators of political groups generally include leadership, discourse, and organization. However, it seems that apart from assessing the presence or absence of each of these indicators, both the institutional quality of these indicators and considering more detailed aspects will enable us to reach a more advanced model to correctly evaluate the obstacles in the path of each institution.

Cellular Organism Structure:

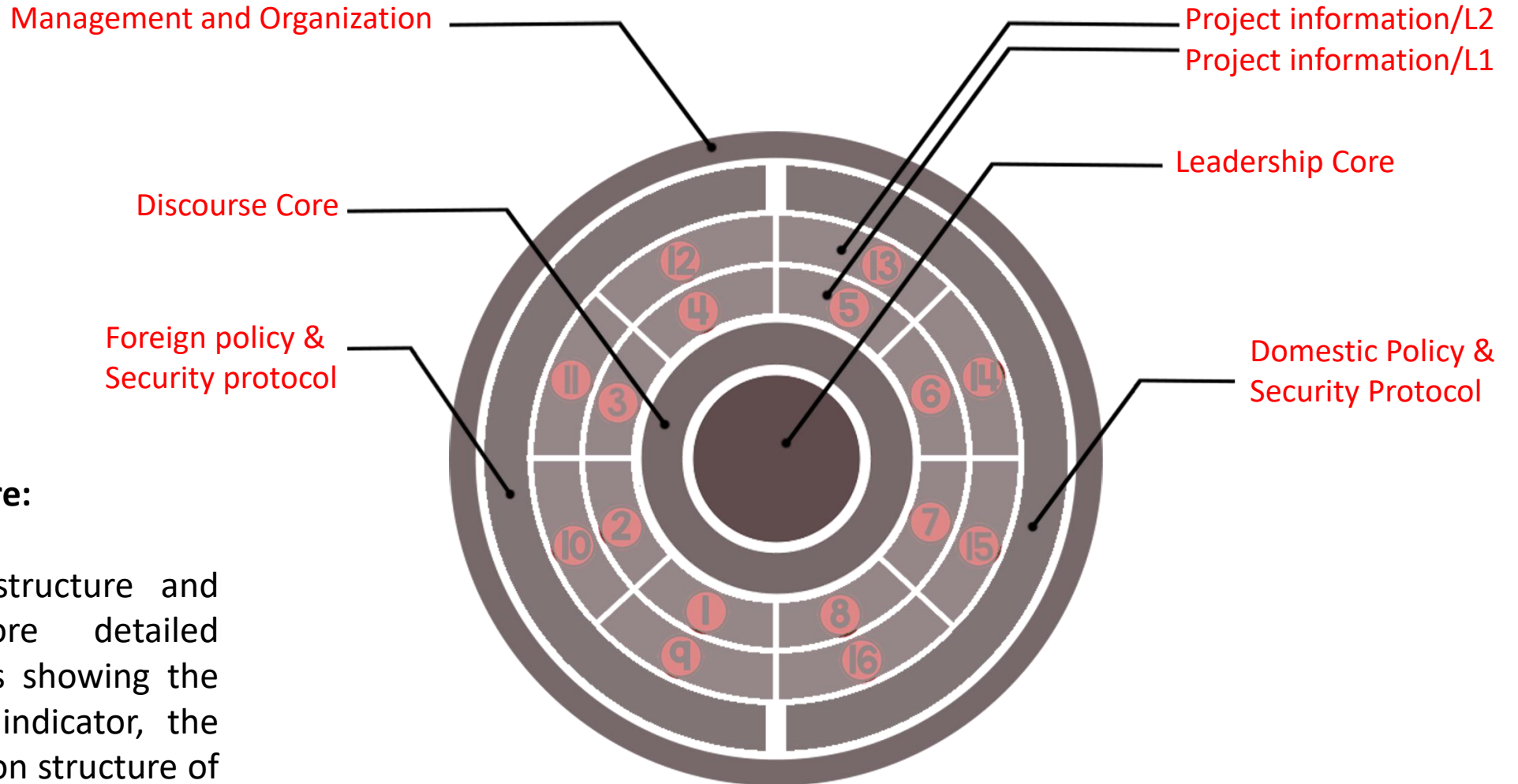
The cell is always recognized as an example of a simple device that covers its own mechanisms and has played a role in the structural assessment of many institutions and organizations, whether hierarchical, horizontal, or vertical. In the first step, the three main indicators of political groups can easily be defined in a cellular organism framework, which consists of:



Core: Leadership

Mantle: Planning and Strategy

Shell: Organization

1- Leadership core:

The leadership of a political institution is directly responsible for the command and planning of other departments.

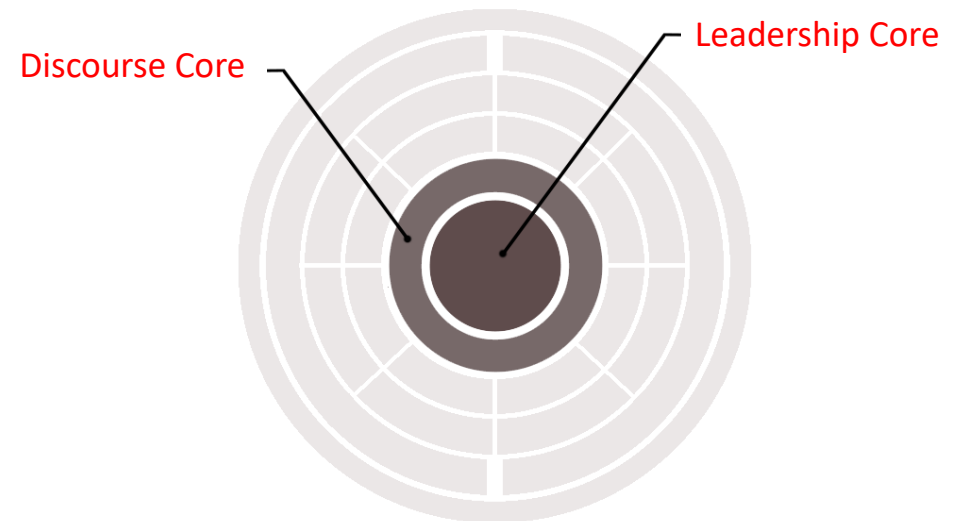
Without leadership, whether in the form of a person or a group, a political institution should be considered empty; In such a way that even if the political institution has a program and discourse, it cannot achieve its organizational goals and will eventually be dissolved or swallowed.

Only political-military leadership in the strategic form of Actor-Structure can be considered a complete leadership.

2- Discourse core

Political discourse is a set of ideas, ideals and methods that a political institution tries to achieve.

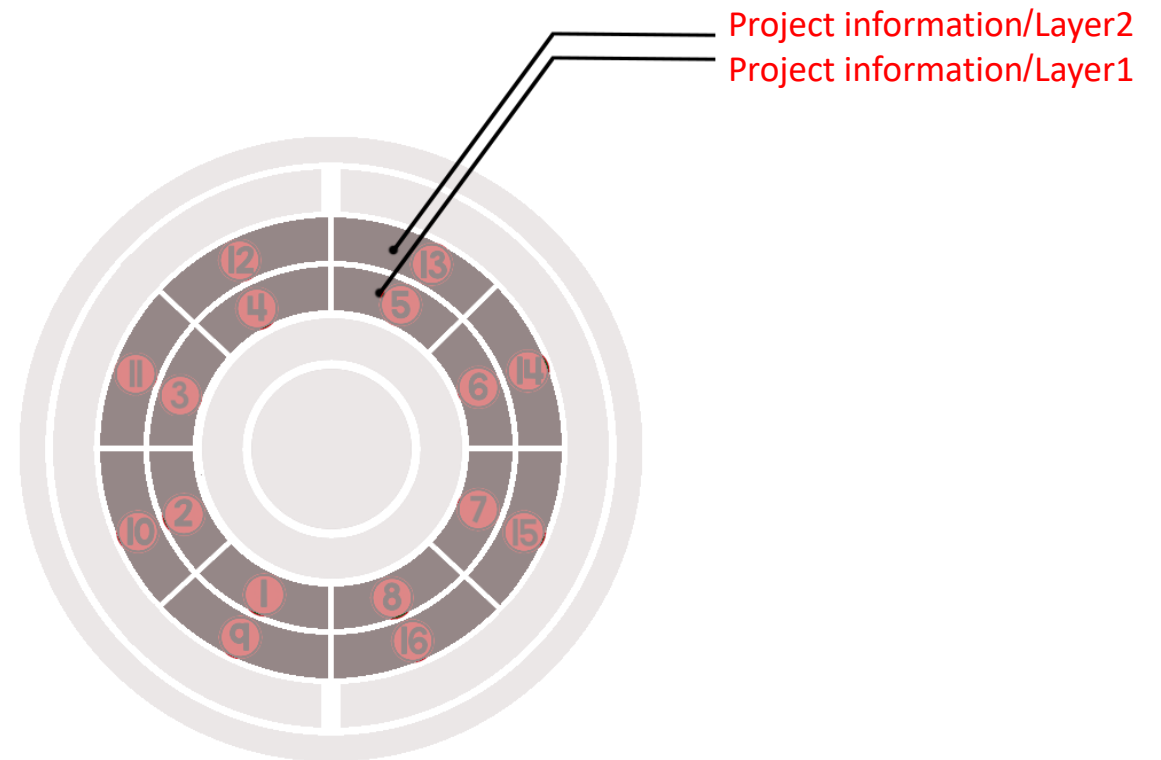
Political discourse is always defined under leadership and takes the form of constitutions, protocols, principles and organization.

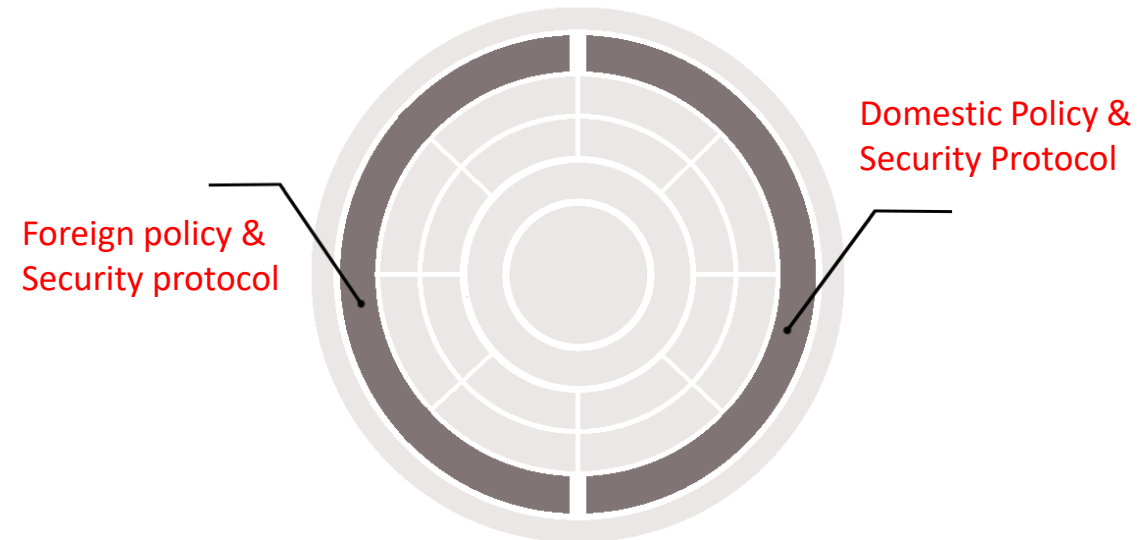


4- Political and Security Protocols

One of the most crucial layers in management and organization during extensive strategic discourse is ensuring the necessary force to introduce a political institution as an alternative or replacement after victory. A political institution must always consider that its conditions and responsibilities are different before and after victory, and in both security and political aspects, whether foreign or domestic, it must have prepared protocols in advance. Skipping this section and leaving it to events or fate is undoubtedly a sign of incompetence and an inability to reconcile strategies with political demands.

In this particular case, opposition forces of the Islamic Republic are confronted with the regime's consolidation with foreign political and military institutions. Furthermore, due to the diversity of discourse up to this point, the call for universal mobilization towards a targeted revolution has been impossible. Covering the capacities of this sector is of utmost importance.

In other words, the inability of any political entity to attract and dominate military forces, ensure the country's security protocols, and also achieve the necessary penetration in breaking the regime's political lines and strongholds is a major deficiency.

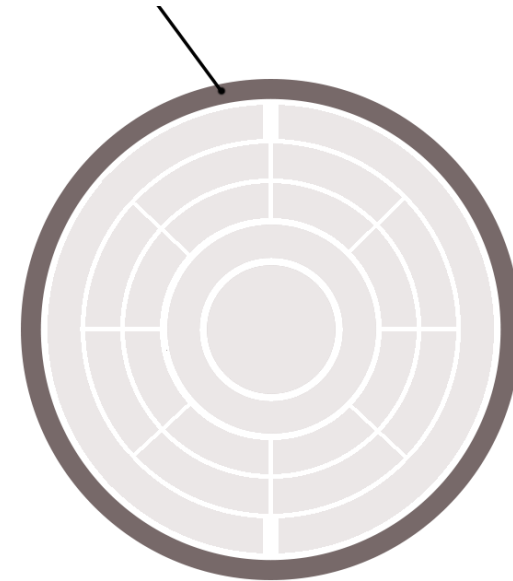


5- Management and Organization

This section is a critical indicator in confirming the social penetration of leadership and discourse, focusing on its target community and successfully attracting the necessary human and logistical resources, as well as creating the required political, popular, or military structure.

Achieving the capacity for organization and management is an exemplary transformation of dreams into reality.

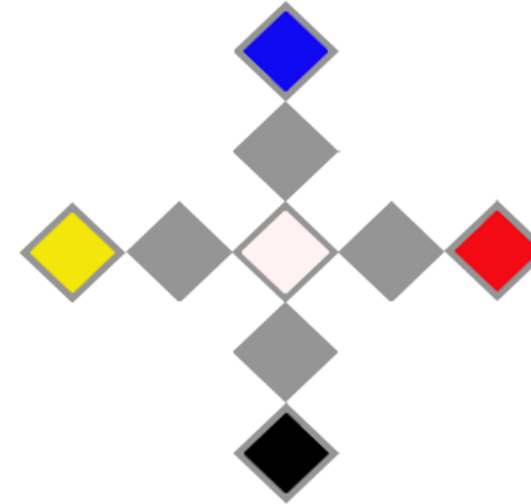
Management and Organization



The quality of information in sections and layers:

Apart from the existence or absence of each organic section of a political institution, attention must be paid to the nature and quality of each section. This is because although a political institution may possess all necessary organic sections, if it lacks the required quality to oppose its political counterpart (whether a rival or the ruling regime), , in this case strategically or functionally, a political institution may act against itself, become destructive or ineffective.

In the current information structure, colors signify the quality of information in various sections and layers, which have been strategically or inherently utilized by political entities.
